## Duvall Chamber Welcome Bags

### Welcome Bag Meeting (recap)

For those who are interested, here is a brief recap of the Welcome Bag meeting we had a few weeks ago. Our delivery team reported that most people were interested in receiving something from local businesses, either a discount (where the actual dollar amount is listed) or something that would encourage them to go to the business.

We also learned that most people are not interested in flyers, brochures or other “marketing” materials. Expiration dates or other time sensitive materials didn’t work very well because of the delay of when bags are delivered.

After going through what actually happens at the door when the bags are delivered, we solicited feedback from those in attendance on how we could improve the program. The number one feedback was 250 items up front were too many and many businesses wanted the opportunity to swap out items for special promotions or for seasonal items. In addition, they wanted feedback of how many bags were going out per week or month. Based on the meeting, we’ve updated our program. See the enrollment form for more information.

### Duvall Chamber of Commerce Welcome Bag Program Enrollment

To welcome newcomers to Duvall, the Chamber puts together a reusable Welcome Bag. The totes are similar to grocery bags imprinted with the Duvall Chamber logo and are delivered to new residents of Duvall and part of Carnation.

All Duvall Chamber members may participate in this program. The cost is \$100 for 250 bags. Members may put any item in bag; however the Welcome Bag Committee may screen items based on size, weight restrictions, duplication or other issues. We will do our best to work with you.

By enrolling into the program, you agree to pay \$100 for the next 250 bags that are delivered. You are not required to provide items for all bags at one time; however, it is your responsibility to monitor how many of your items are currently available. You may modify, change or replace the items that go into the bag at any time. Please note: we have limited storage space, so you may not be able to store all of your items at the Chamber office.

The Chamber is not responsible for notifying you if the items are low or have run out. If you miss some bags because we didn’t have your items, you agree to forfeit those bags.
