# Minutes of the August 4th General Meeting

Aaron Keating, Chamber President called the meeting to order at 7:40 am.

There were 24 members and guest in attendance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said and the following new members and guests were introduced: Jamie Slutzky with Fit with Flair, Shelly Burtis of Cherry Valley Kid's Kastle Childcare and Preschool, Leroy Collinwood, candidate for Duvall City Counsel, Will Ibershof, Mayor of Duvall, and Kim Engelkens of the Duvall Historical Society.

**Reports:**

**SnoValley Tour dePeaks – August 14, 2011** - Mary Lou Dreher reported that there will be a Food and Rest Stop for the Tour dePeaks in Gary Rutledge's Duvall Chiropractic Center's parking lot on August 14 to accommodate those bikers who wish to stop in Duvall.

**Garden Tour** – Mary Lou Dreher & Erin Muir reported that this event was very successful and look forward to doing it again next year.

**Country Living Festival** – Kris Wentworth reported that everything went great, after the rain stopped. Everyone enjoyed themselves and the fireworks were great. They have already had their first meeting for next year's event and asked for volunteers to help.

**Directory** – Tracy Lewis, Directory Chairperson reported that the committee will meet soon to get this year's directory started and a tentative deadline of Oct. 31, 2011 has been set.

**Aaron Keating**, president, gave a brief presentation on his thoughts about getting the city government and businesses of Duvall to come up with a "Common Theme" that can be worked towards in getting people motivated to get people shopping locally and bring outsiders into town. He asked those present to come up with ideas and present them at the next general meeting.

**Speakers: Will Ibershof**, Mayor of Duvall, was introduced and he talked about several things that were happening in the City and some of the problems that the city faces because of its unique location (including flood plains). He said that there will be some improvements to the entrance to McCormick Park, as well as projects to fix up the Depot and put in a community fire pit on ground near the police department. The cost of these projects is approximately \$400,000.

He most specifically talked about the upcoming 2013 Centennial. He stated that the City has seeded \$2000 to the help fund the celebration and has turned over the main planning to the Duvall Historical Society.

**Kim Engelkes** of the Duvall Historical Society gave a brief presentation on what is happening so far. They have a "Core Group", which include City, Business and Community representatives to help in the planning and want to make it a year long event. They are recommending that the Centennial be worked into the regular yearly events such as the Country Living Festival, Pancake breakfast, Sandblast and any other events that take place on a regular basis. They are also looking for volunteers to serve on the various committees.

Major Ibershof then answered several questions from the audience regarding city matters such as the Broadstripe contract which is currently being re-negotiated and he was ask to put in request for better customer service, better programming , and to extend the service to the more outlying rural areas. He also invited Chamber members to speak before Council meetings and a discussion was held about adding a City Council Representative as a non-voting member of the Chamber Board. The Board will take this matter up at the next Board meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 am. The next General Meeting will be held September 1 at the Adventure Church.

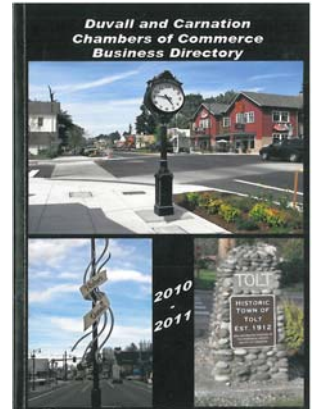

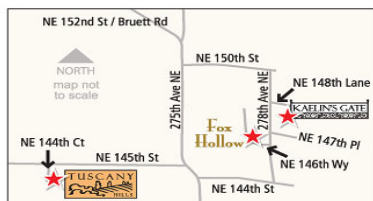

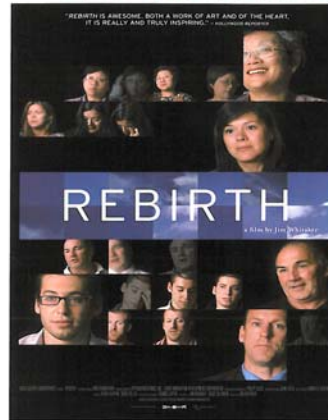
