The Duvall Historical Society - January 4th Meeting

Aron Johnson, Masters of Architecture graduate, will be speaking at the Duvall Historical Society meeting on **January 4th, 2010 at 7:30 pm**. He will be presenting a talk based on his Master's thesis, an exploration into the potential reuse and reconfiguration of historic farmsteads. The study will offer answers to the challenges of small scale twenty-first century farming. Aron uses a local historic farm in Carnation as a potential example, in which sustainable small scale farming could be reintroduced into an existing farmstead. Food security is a critical component to the goal of sustainable urbanism and greater reliance on local food production represents a significant step toward this goal. The Duvall Historical Society welcomes the public to attend this meeting to learn more about the history of the Snoqualmie Valley's farming heritage, and how the ideas presented in this project might preserve farms, and serve to sustain the region's rich farming heritage, local food sources, and greener ecological processes.

Aron Johnson is a recent graduate of the Masters of Architecture program at the University of Washington, with an emphasis in historic preservation. Mr. Johnson is keenly interested in the preservation of local farming for its potential to bind communities together through the medium of food, as well as through the agrarian structures, which provide a tangible account of a community's collective history.

The Society meets at the Dougherty House on the first Monday of each month at 7:30 p.m., September through June. The Dougherty House is located at 26526 NE Cherry Valley Road. Duvall Historical Society's Vision is to: preserve, record, publish and promote appreciation of the history of Duvall, the community the pioneers knew as Cherry Valley, and the lower Snoqualmie Valley. We believe in the power of history and the preservation of our culture.
